Back by popular demand, Lois and her string-playing colleagues are cooking up another delicious musical "repat" for 2026. She and the other members of her Eleuthera Piano Trio---will be joined by the wonderful local violist, Elaine Leisinger-- on Sunday, November 22nd at 2pm, at Laurel's house for another special afternoon of luminous and much beloved piano quartets: this time, Mozart E-flat Major, K.493, and Brahms A Major, Op.26!

For Brahms, Mozart's clarity and classical musical values were a beacon of inspiration, as he rejected the thick textures and Romantic "too-muchness" of other composers in late 19th century Vienna. They also share the versatility of the piano quartet texture--the intimacy of four solo instruments combining in different permutations, to ultimately create a symphonic richness.

And, as Brahms expressed about both his own and Mozart's ambition: "the greatest joy is in creating something that speaks directly to the soul of another human being."
